OSSM Students Elected to OMRF Teen Leaders

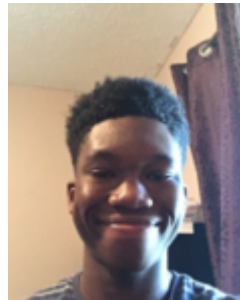

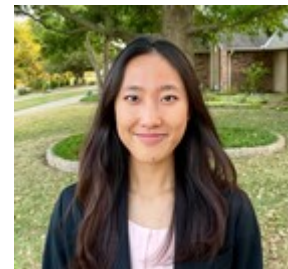
Kareem Raimi was excited for all the various opportunities. He said, "I am more than thrilled to be a part of the OMRF Teen Leader board, and I look forward

to getting involved in various communities. Philanthropy is very important to me, so I am glad that OMRF Teen leadership provides a platform where I can advocate improving human health."

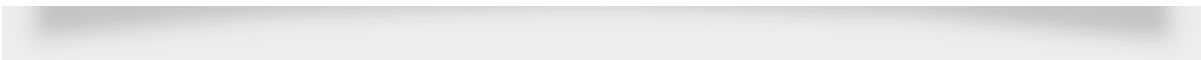
